

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is a literacy engagement program that aims to:

- Encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading.
- Improve literacy levels.

to complete the challenge?

To complete the Premier's Reading Challenge, students need to read 12 books between week 1, term 1 and week 7 term 3 (September 5th).

1. Every student will need a Student Reading Record. This has been given to your student or can be downloaded [here](#).
2. Read 12 books. Eligible books include e-books, audio books, class/shared reading, prescribed books for school, non-fiction books, books read as research for assignments or books in another language.
 - * Reception to Year 6: Students must read 8 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and 4 personal choice books.
 - * Year 7 to Year 9: Students must read 4 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and 8 personal choice books.
3. Complete the Student Reading Record with the title and author for each book. A parent, caregiver, teacher or librarian must sign off on each book to verify it has been read.
4. Pass on the completed Student Reading Record to the school's Premier's Reading Challenge coordinator by the designated due date.
5. Students who complete the Challenge receive awards for their achievements, ranging from a certificate in their first year, to a Reader for Life medal in their eighth year. We also have a school celebration in Term 4 for those that complete the challenge.

How do we know what books to read?

You can use the handy PRC stickers to identify suitable books:

- Reception to Year 2 (**red**)
- Year 3 -5 (**green**)
- Year 6-9 (**yellow**)



These are on school library books, books at Public Libraries, or they can be identified by searching the PRC website – book list
