The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is a literacy engagement program that aims to:

- Encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading.
- Improve literacy levels.

to complete the challenge?

To complete the Premier's Reading Challenge, students need to read 12 books between week 1, term 1 and week 7 term 3 (September 5th).

- 1. Every student will need a Student Reading Record. This has been given to your student or can be downloaded <u>here</u>.
- 2. Read 12 books. Eligible books include e-books, audio books, class/shared reading, prescribed books for school, non-fiction books, books read as research for assignments or books in another language.
 - * Reception to Year 6: Students must read 8 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and 4 personal choice books.

* Year 7 to Year 9: Students must read 4 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and 8 personal choice books.

- 3. Complete the Student Reading Record with the title and author for each book. A parent, caregiver, teacher or librarian must sign off on each book to verify it has been read.
- 4. Pass on the completed Student Reading Record to the school's Premier's Reading Challenge coordinator by the designated due date.
- 5. Students who complete the Challenge receive awards for their achievements, ranging from a certificate in their first year, to a Reader for Life medal in their eighth year. We also have a school celebration in Term 4 for those that complete the challenge.

How do we know what books to read?

You can use the handy PRC stickers to identify suitable books:

- Reception to Year 2 (red)
- Year 3 -5 (green)
- Year 6-9 (yellow)



These are on school library books, books at Public
